
# **Total Health Care Spending**

#### National

\$2.5 Trillion spent on Health Care in the U.S. in 2009

#### Virginia

\$49 Billion spent on Health Care in Virginia in 2009





Virginia's share of national health care spending is roughly 2% of the national total

## Estimated Amount of Waste in Health Care


(includes public and private funding for 2009)

## Virginia


Estimated Waste: \$15 Billion or 30% of total health care spending
