I believe that most Americans live lives more or less like ours and that, therefore, there are just not the vast numbers of us necessary to minister in any kind of reliable, ongoing way to the sick and the needy among us in our communities, in our state, or in our country.

This is where I think government comes in: to collect in taxes from each of us fortunate enough to reap the benefits of our society the amounts necessary not only to look to those of our collective worldly needs that are larger than we can provide on our own--protecting us and our families and providing us with an infrastructure that we can make use of in our various pursuits--but also, critically, to help us do the job we are spiritually called to do--to collectively care for the less fortunate among us. These days, there are barely enough churches or nonprofits or volunteers to staff and support soup kitchens, let alone to provide health care (or housing) for the needy.
